Thanks too, to the members that were interested enough to attend committee meetings as visitors. Throughout the year we have had interesting guest speakers and no doubt this will continue into 2020 with a few changes to the time set aside for speakers and some different formats.

2019 saw OCSA membership grow rapidly with the addition of 100 members pushing our membership to 400. We, as a club, must thank Neutrog Fertilisers for being a major part of that growth with their new member sponsorship. They also sponsor the growing Orchids In Schools program for all the fertiliser needs. Talking of the Schools program we have added another school with Urrbrae Agricultural School joining in 2020. This gives us seven schools in the OIS program.

The beginner's group held before the main nightly meeting continues to attract a good number of members and is a most worthwhile exercise and should continue into the new year hopefully with various experienced growers leading the discussion.

The OCSA monthly meetings, both day and night, are well attended and the major shows, Autumn, Winter and Spring, were all successful events. Our Autumn show

involvement with other floral interest clubs at the Festival of Flowers is proving to be extremely popular and this event is the biggest flower show in the state. Once again, the club's involvement in facilitating the Royal Show orchid competition and displays was a great success and we look forward to the Royal Show in 2020. This is a different judging format to our other major shows but continues to be popular with both growers and the public. The Orchids In Schools students took to the Horticulture Stage in the Goyder Pavilion again this year and proved to be just as popular as in years gone by. This year we had a teacher and four students from Woomera Area School attend the show as presenters for the first time. This was in addition to the presentations given on behalf of the club. Many thanks to Neutrog Fertilisers for their generous donation of products that are handed out during these talks. Not just OCSA/OIS talks but all the horticulture presentations.

OCSA excursions are still popular, with Neutrog factory tours and the river paddle steamer cruise all well attended. Thanks to the organisers for arranging these interesting day trips. The Saturday workshops continue to be popular and many thanks to those who provided their homes to hold these events.

The club's 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary was celebrated during 2019 with the release of the Anniversary wine, the Anniversary event at Government House and the Anniversary Raffle. Thanks to everyone who was involved especially Loom Wines who created the wine.

In November the annual Socialising with Sarcs dinner was held and this popular event will keep going. It is most unusual to have an event that celebrates a single orchid genus but owing to the ongoing love of these plants this event shall be a regular fixture on our calendar.

On a sad note I must mention the tragic bushfires that have occurred during the last months of 2019 and are ongoing. I have heard of the loss of an orchid collection in the Woodside fire that dated back a couple of generations. No doubt across Australia there have been many other collections lost and orchids that grow in the wild would have been devastated. Hopefully the commercial nurseries have come through in reasonable condition.

# FROM THE REGISTRAR FOR DECEMBER 2019

I take this opportunity to thank all the members who have brought their plants in for judging throughout the year, and to sincerely thank all the judges that have participated at meetings and shows. It has been a quieter year with less plants on benches than previous years, and hopefully all our new members will soon start showing plants. Happy growing and showing in 2020. Registrar, Wendy Lodge.

**Plant of Open Division and Registrar's Choice** was the plant *Cymbidium* Kuranda 'Arthur Dawson' owned and grown by Michael Willoughby and Oui Ju. The judging panel choose this plant which had about 40 flowering inflorescences displayed all around the pot, with each inflorescence having between 40 to 50 small flowers that were mustard yellow/green in colour with a maroon marking on the labellum, which comes from *Cym. suave. Cym.* Kuranda is a primary hybrid registered in 1972 of *Cymbidium* (*suave* x *madidum*), which are both Australian Native Cymbidiums with small flowers. This is a worthwhile plant to grow at this time of the year. Congratulations to Michael and Oui for growing and showing this lovely plant.

Michael and Oui let us know that they grow this plant cool, in medium sized bark, underneath 70% beige shade cloth. It gets watered 2-3 times a week in summer, but only natural rain throughout winter, and fertilizing 2-3 times weakly/weekly in summer and weekly in winter.



weak dilution every 2<sup>nd</sup> watering.

**Plant of First Division** was another Cymbidium. This was *Cym*. Cricket 'Rosetta' grown by Wendy and Michael Lodge. This was a well presented plant with 12 inflorescences, each with approx. 36 small brown flowers typical of *Cym*. Cricket, with color, shape and spike habit, with a contrasting maroon labellum. It is a hybrid of *Cym*. (*devonianum* x *madidum*) that was registered in 1964. It is another plant that flowers at the end of the year that can be grown into a large specimen plant.

Wendy grows this plant hanging under 50% black shade cloth, it gets watered when needed throughout winter and at least 1-2 times a week during summer, using sprinklers late afternoons when the temperature goes over 32 degrees. Main fertilizer used is Neutrog Liquid Strike Bank for Orchids in

**Plant of Second Division** this time was *Paphiopedilum* Hsinying Boston. This plant belonging to Coleen Peters came in with its label saying *Paph*. (Hsinying Art Pie x Laserlight) and it was found to be registered with the Royal Horticultural Society given



the name of *Paph*. Hsinying Boston. Thanks to Judge James Argent for finding this out. This Paphiopedilum (commonly known as Lady's Slipper Orchid) is an excellent example of a well grown and well flowered plant). For a small plant, this had a very large flower and it should grow fairly easily in Adelaide. It will need protection in winter, but most likely will not require heat.

Whilst the species in the background (being *Paph. sukhakulii*, *Paph. callosum*, *Paph. lawrencianum* and *Paph.* 

*mastersianum*) may sometimes be a little touchy, the hybrids have what is called hybrid vigour, and become quite hardy and well worth growing.

According to Coleen, she grows this plant cool in a mix of small orchid bark and perlite. She waters in winter about once a week, while in summer it could be daily, she uses Maxicrop seaweed as fertilizer and has only had the plant for about 2 years. Well done Coleen on such a beautifully presented plant.



Plant of Orchids in Schools Division was the plant of Cattlianthe Trick or Treat 'Orange Beauty' grown by the students at Willunga High school. It was chosen because it was a well grown plant with one inflorescence that had 11 bright orange flowers in a cluster on top of the tall bulb. This crossing was registered in 1973 and has 4 species in the background. Gur. aurantiaca, С. cinnabarina, C. crispata and C. harpophylla. It's an old hybrid and we see it often on the show bench. It can look impressive as a big

plant with multiple inflorescences and its bright colour. It was bought in by Trevor Garard who is the mentor at Willunga High School.

Trevor writes that this Cattlianthe is growing in straight bark, is very easy to grow, and he recommends it for any collection, especially novice growers. The students water the plant weekly in winter, then 3 times a week in summer receiving fertilizer once a week for most of the year. Another fine plant from these students.
