





## FESTIVAL OF FLOWERS & AUTUMN SHOW

The Festival of Flowers & OCSA Autumn show will be held at St Paul's College, 792 Grand Junction Road Gilles Plains on Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> & Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> April 2020

**Put In:** On Friday 24<sup>th</sup> of April between 4.00pm & 6.00pm.

Entry will be available via **Blacks Road Gate No 4** into the college quadrangle for unloading on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> and for loading after 4:00pm on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup>. **All** vehicles must then be removed to the designated college car parks.

No vehicles are permitted to be parked within the college grounds.

## Judging will begin at 6:00pm on Friday 24<sup>th</sup>.

**Parking:** Parking will be available in the college car park during the show on Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> & Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> April 2020.

Parking is not permitted in the College grounds other than the general car parks. Parking is **NOT** permitted in the general school quadrangle except for loading and unloading.

## Blacks Road gate No 4 is then strictly for emergency use only.

**Foliage Plants:** These can be brought in with your orchids, make sure that your exhibitor's number is on all pots. Please bring in as many as you can.

<u>Plants and Labelling:</u> Your plants should be presented ready for exhibition. Please ensure that the correct label for your Division is attached to each plant, displaying the plant name and your exhibitor number on the label.

**Take Out**: Take out will occur after 4:00pm on Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> April 2020. Exhibits must not be removed from the show before this time without the approval of the Show Marshall. All plants must be removed; if a member is unable to remove their plants and wishes to have another person pick them up please notify the Show Marshall before take-out.

**Show schedules:** These will be available for members at the March and April club meetings.

**Show helpers:** If you can assist with the running of the show, on the BBQ, Plant sales stall or help out in the kitchen your help will be very much appreciated. Please contact the Show Marshall if you are able to assist.

**Trading Table:** Bring your plants through the side entrance of the hall after 4:00pm on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> of April and check them in with the trading table helpers.

Ensure all labels and dockets are fully and correctly filled in, otherwise plants may not be accepted for sale. Present your sale plants in the condition you would expect them to be in if you were purchasing the plant.

**NOTE**: The club has purchased new style labels that are to be used for sale plants; **NO OTHER** plant label type will be accepted. Labels will be available for purchase from the Trading Table at  $5\phi$  per label.

Growers please note: - Plants suspected of being infected with virus, disease or insect infestation will not be eligible for competition and such plants will be asked to be removed from the show.



An admission fee of \$3.00 will be charged for entry.

**PLEASE NOTE** due to Anzac Day on the Saturday the 25<sup>th</sup> April 2020 entry doors will be open from 12 noon until 4:00pm; Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> April 2020 entry doors will be open from 10am until 4:00pm.

## FROM THE REGISTRAR FOR FEBRUARY 2020

#### Plant of Open Division and Registrar's Choice

Judge John Lampard told the members that the Panel chose *Paphiopedilum* Mount Toro 'Arabella' as plant of the Division. This pant has been grown by Graeme and Maureen Hazledine. It is a primary hybrid between species *Paph.* (*stonei* x *philippinense*) and is what is called a multi floral Paphiopedilum. Both parents have the long petals with the twisting inherited from *Paph. philippinense*. This plant is exceptionally well grown and demonstrates what Judges look for when they talk about "Show Condition". The flowers are very well displayed, and the leaves are almost blemish free. This orchid has been awarded an AM with the Australian Orchid Council and this is a piece of the actual awarded plant. This is not a beginner's plant to grow. It needs good light and humidity and likes to be grown in a temperature range from 10°C to about 30°C and the flowers will last for between 6-10 weeks on the plant. Well Done.

Maureen explains how they grow this fabulous plant. The plant grows in a glasshouse, heated in the Winter on a thermostat control temperature between 10°C and 30°C, in the summer Air Con keeps the temperature between 28°C and 30°C, and it may drop down below 28°C if the nights are a bit cooler. There are misters under the benches and bark on the floor. They water in Summertime every 3 days with rainwater and in Wintertime every 5-7 days, depending on the weather. They fertilize every 3<sup>rd</sup> watering with Blossom Booster or Strike Back, or Hi Nitrogen (Orchid Fert.) They use small to medium bark depending on the pot size. Maureen also adds a little bit of marble chips.

#### **Plant of First Division**



Judge Les Nesbit spoke about the plant of the Division being *Prosthechea* Green Hornet, belonging to Hoa Nguyen and Dat Van Tran. This is a well grown plant of the primary hybrid of *Psh.* (*cochleata* x *trulla*) made in 1995 by H. & R. Nursery in Hawaii. The plant presented with 4 very fresh inflorescences, displaying 7-8 flowers of the 'cockle shell' shape on each. The contrasting lip is uppermost on the flower – referred to as non-resupinate. It is growing in a mix of medium bark and marble chips. Congratulations.

Hoa writes to tell us that they grow this plant in intermediate conditions, watering every second day during summer, and once a week in the winter time. They use Peters Excel and Special K as fertilizers, and Hoa comments that it is easy to grow.



#### Plant of Second Division

Judge Steve Howard talked about a plant of *Dendrobium* Limestone which was chosen to be plant of the Division which belongs to Colleen Peters. It is another primary hybrid plant, the parents being *Den.* (bowmannii x cucumerinum) that was registered in 1985. Both parents had the narrow rat-tailed leaves and flowers that present upside down (non-resupinate) with the labellum

upper most. This hybrid likes to grow in dappled light, with cool to warm conditions and prefers 50%-60% humidity. Keep it moist in the Spring/Summer when in active growth. Grow it in a pot with free draining medium or on a slab of tree fern. Remember to reduce watering during the cooler months and only use ½ strength fertilizer.

Colleen gave us a short version of how she grows her Dendrobium. It hangs in her shade house under 70% shade cloth, gets watered daily in summer and weekly in winter. She uses Maxicrop as fertilizer for all her orchids and it was growing in a mix of small bark and perlite.

#### Plant of Orchids in Schools Division



Judge Ron Yates told the meeting that *Stenoglottis macgloughlanii* was the plant chosen for Schools Division. It was a small specimen plant with 7 racemes of small white flowers with a pink flush, set above a pot full of clean green leaves. This Stenoglottis is a summer grower, dormant in winter, and then reshoots in spring from a cluster of fleshy roots. It is grown by the students at Kildare College, and it originally comes from South Africa. There are 4 different species that are grown in South Australia, the most common being *Stenoglottis longifolia*, which flowers in Autumn. It can be grown in a shade house all year round and needs to be repotted in

winter. Well done, Kildare Students.

Kildare College mentor Les Nesbit writes that this terrestrial plant is grown cool, gets watered regularly in summer, getting the same fertilizers as Cymbidiums in the summer, and is growing in a sandy soil mix. The leaves die off in early winter, then reshoot in spring.


